Yasmina Vinci, Executive Director, National Head Start Association

A seasoned leader in both executive and policy roles, Yasmina Vinci's professional experience and capabilities have delivered improvements in the lives of children at the national, state, and local levels. Yasmina joined the National Head Start Association after several years as principal and founder of EDGE Consulting Partners. She founded EDGE after receiving her Master in Public Administration degree from Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government. Tommy Sheridan is the Senior Director of Government Affairs for the National Head Start Association (NHSA) in Alexandria, VA. He came to NHSA in June 2009 and has been in his current role since 2019.
